GETTING STARTED

- 1. Describe someone you admire who has handled difficulties very well. What is it about them that you admire?
- 2. Can you think of a challenge in your life that turned out to be a blessing? Why was it a benefit in your life?
- 3. Is there anything in this week's message that caught your attention, challenged you or confused you?

DIGGING DEEPER

- 1. Read James 1:2-4. In your own words, what reason did James give for Christians to be joyful in their trials? Do you agree with this passage?
- 2. Read 1 Peter 4:12-14. This passage talks about rejoicing in suffering, but for different reasons than the passage in James. What reasons are given? When have you felt you suffered for Christ? How did you feel?
- 3. Read Matthew 6:25-34. This passage instructs us not to worry. How does this passage "compliment" what is said in the previous passages? In what way does thankfulness remove worry?
- 4. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 says rejoice always and be thankful in all circumstances. Take some time to list all the things you are thankful to God for. Be specific. Why do we often take things for granted? Why should we give thanks for everything?

TAKE AWAY

- 1. Take time to list everything in your life that you can thank God for and then dedicate a daily routine of thanking God for all He has done.
- 2. Are you, or someone you know, going through difficulties right now? How can you be an encourager to yourself or others this week?
- 3. How can people be praying for you this week?
