Timeless principle found in Luke 2:15-20

1. **Our Song is a living expression of Trusting in God and Sharing God's love with others.**

*Go, See, Hurry, Find, Tell, Keep praising, Trust God*

<b>Us</b>	<b>Shepherds</b> Luke 2:15-20
GO	Let's Go to Bethlehem
SEE	Let's See this thing that has happened
HURRY	They hurried to the village
FIND	They Found Mary, Joseph, and Jesus
TELL	They told everyone what happened and what the angel had said to them about the child
KEEP	Mary kept these things in her heart and thought of them often. The meaning of what was happening. A new understanding of Jesus.
PRAISING	They went back to their flocks, glorifying and praising God for all they had seen and heard.
TRUST	It was just as the angel told them, just as the Lord had told them.
